Visible continuously. Size estimated at 20 ft diameter and elevation from 50 ft to 1/2 mile during motion. No exhaust or contrails. Also observed through BX. Similar object observed on 7 Jan. Witness called police who in turn called Dayton Tower Operator who confirmed presence of light. Observation through BX. Wife believed there were two additional objects.

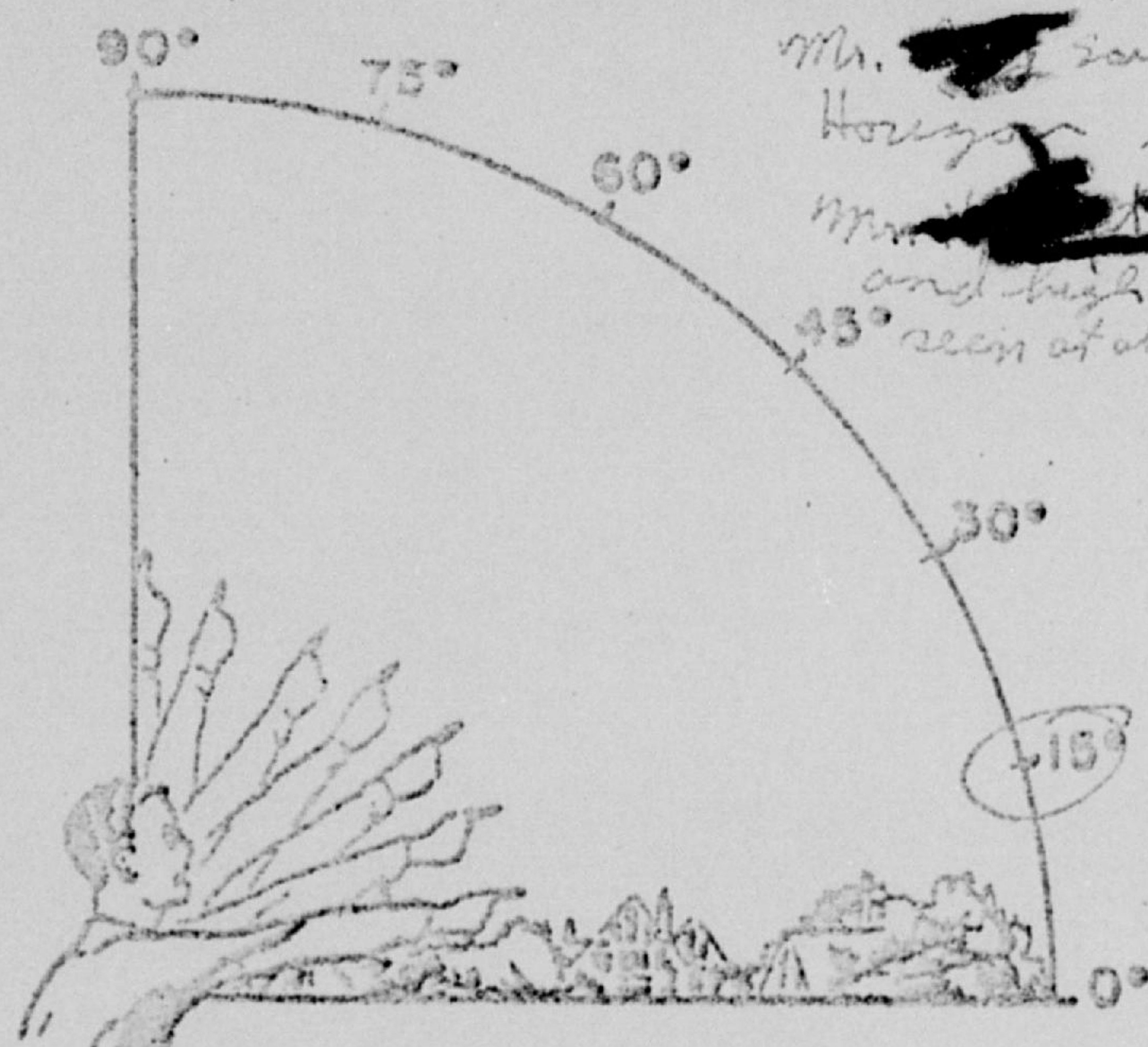

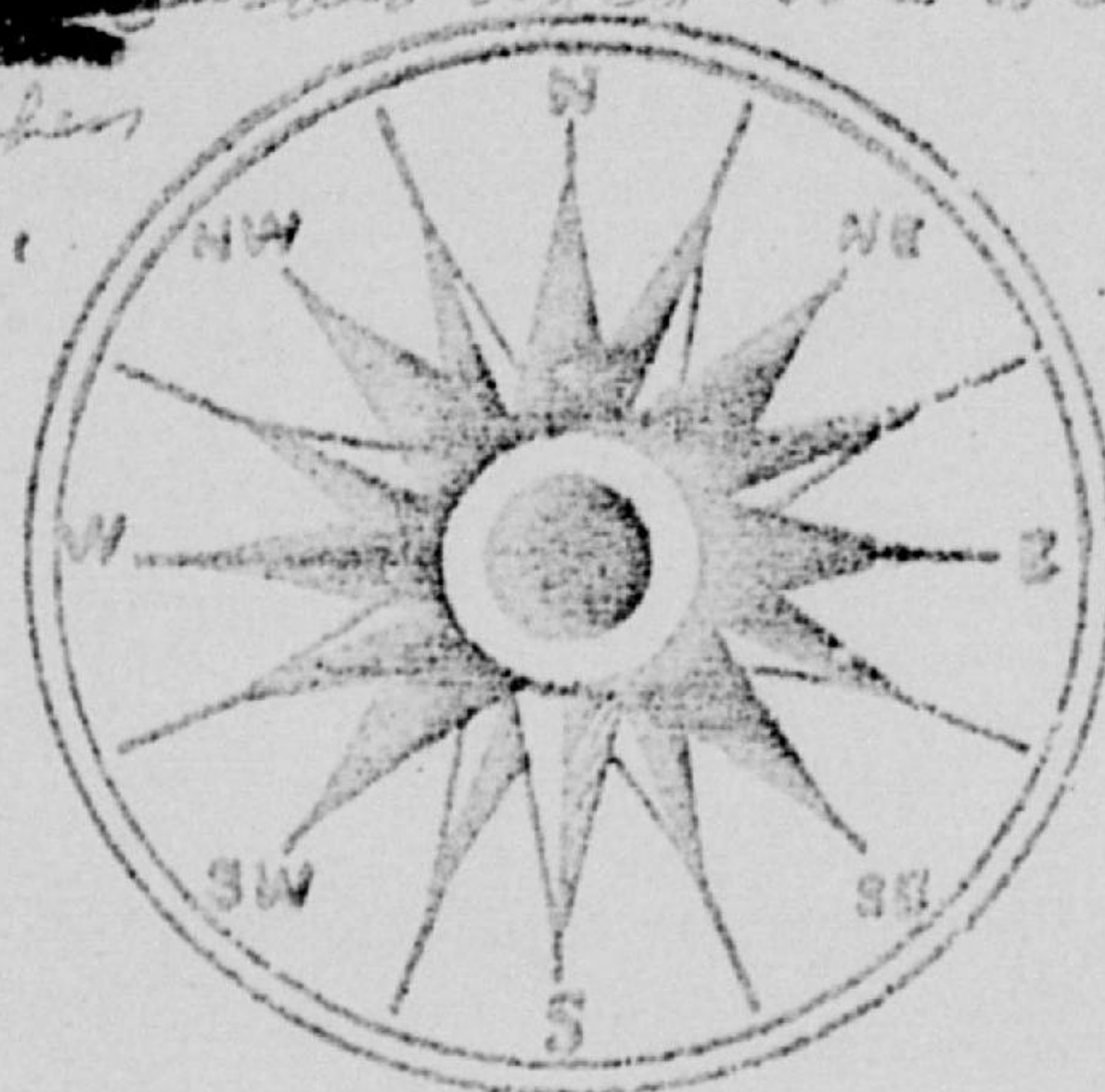

1. Call from Highway Patrol - Patrolman Metstler (?) phone 277-6544 who had been called by Mr. [redacted] at about 2310. Patrolman had called Dayton tower at Vandalia Airport where they had observed redish-orange glow in sky. - Then called WPAFB.
 2. I called Dayton tower and talked to Mr. Robert Hall 898-4423 who also saw object with eyes + glasses as an erratic movement redish-orange object that he thought to be an aircraft. AT 2320 the object was high in the sky at a west north west direction, Traveling slowly and apparently japping in erratic movements. - No definite identification could not see object at 2345 while talking to Mr. Hall - 3 or 4 others observed.
 3. I Then called Mr. [redacted] at Pleasant Hill, Ohio [redacted] who gave the original sighting and verification by wife. He said object redish-orange and varied to white and faded in + out (dim + bright) and had moved from 50 feet to one-half mile in height. Size undetermined, (estimated 20' diameter). Stated that wife thought distance unknown (down the road). She saw two additional objects, wife had seen similar occurrence on Thursday, 7 Jan 65, at night.
- Tonight - Cold-dry temperature 20 to 22°F no moon, clear with considerable stars out.

Completed phone calls + report at 0015, about 1 hour and 10 minutes after reported sighting began.
