A Thorough check of the area of sighting by the investigating officer revealed no additional information. The sparseness of growth in the area made possible a thorough search, but with negative results.

Before covering information received from Mrs a description of the area behind the Crabtree house is needed in order to better understand and evaluate the facts.

The land behind the Crabtree house is level for about ten yards, forming a natural yard. The next hundred yards raises at a slow gradual rate and is sparsely covered by grass and weeds. After that the ground rises at a more rapid rate forming a hill roughly two (2) hundred yards from the house.

The hill is covered much like the other ground, with the addition of scattered bushes and trees. Past the hill is typicall Ohio rolling terrain with scattered farms.

Following is information given by Mrs. Introduction is made of a ground sighting by Mrs. Which may or may not be connected with the original sighting, but is submitted because of the short time spen between the two sightings.

kitchen a glance out the window revealed a sort of pole, sticking out of the ground in a place where are no poles. A light in the back yard was turned on but did not illuminate the pole any better. (See drawing, attachment #1 for position of houses, yard light, and apparent pole). The "pole" disappeared.

Later that evening Debie called from the bathroom that there was some kind of pole sticking up from the rear corner of the house next door. At first Mrs thought it was the neighbors TV antenna, but a closer look showed the pole to be not on the corner of the house but out beyond the corner at approximately the same position she had seen it earlier.

At this time Mrs. got a flashlight and went to the rear porch, and played the beam up and down the pole. It looked like a large automobile antenna, chromelike, about thirty feet tall. It appeared to have no base, and was topped by a small, gold collored ball. She then went to call her husband. When she returned the pole had disappeared.

It was at this time she decided to let and and write of their experience.

The incidents of the television interference and the pole appearance, could possibly have been caused by some sort fo weather phenomenom and were included in this report only because of the short span of time during which all three incidents occurred.



On the evening of the above date I along with my son was leaving a class at the Technical College in the city of Halifax, Province of Nova Scotia, and my attention was drawn to what appeared to be somthing like a group of jets in close packed formation, like that used when aerial displays are put on for the Public.


After watching for 3 seconds the absence of sound, and the appearence of what appeared to be some sort of jet thrust back further from the what had first appeared to be jets I concluded that this could not be so, as the rate of speed was sufficent to allow the sound to return to my place of vision.

Then the appearence of a bright whitish light in front and above the three lights (see diagram) that I had not previously noticed came to my attention, this kept the same rate of speed as the 3 distinct lights below and in back, and what appeared to be some sort of violet blussh flame (like that of a Acytelene torch) was seen to be emitting some sort of power like the thrust of a motor, the arch of vision was approximately 70-80 degrees, and then the lights dissappeared behind some clouds.

Was of size of perhaps 1000-1500 in length as it appeared to be a the height of 50-75,000 ft, and for the spacing of the light if the lights were some sort of port holes or observation areas the rate of speed was not that great that it could not have been some type of large jet plane but of enormous size. 

We have received your letter dated March 25, 1965, and from your account of the event on March 16, 1965, it appears that you witnessed the orbital decay and stmospheric reentry of portions of a Soviet scientific satellite. COSMOS 57, Isunched by the U.S.S.R. on February 22, 1965, is known to have broken into over 100 significant pieces of which seven decayed from orbit, reentered the earth's atmosphere, and burned up on the evening of March 16, 1965. This conclusion is further evidenced by your altitude estimate of 50-75,000 feet—this is the altitude range where decaying orbital objects become luminescent from the friction created upon entering the atmosphere at orbital velocity.


