Gentlemen:

On 1 September 1965, I noticed something you may wish to investigate. At 2030 hours, seven (7) miles south of Manistee, Michigan, I sighted two (2) lights which appeared to be wing lights of an airplane. After watching for a few seconds, it was obvious there was no sound. The sky was very clear; there was no apparent wind. This was also witnessed by my fiancee and parents.

When first sighted the two lights were traveling in a southeasterly direction. While the lights were still clearly visible, they reversed direction traveling into the northwest without any turns for banking. During the southeasterly direction, rather than nearing the horizon as they went further away, they elevated.

After reversing directions, instead of being side by side, the lights were one above the other. The top light (both were white) also had a red flashing light visible. When these lights were almost directly overhead, there was still no sound. This was approximately five (5) minutes after they were first sighted.

As we turned northward to continue our watch, another light appeared from a southerly direction, accompanied by the sound associated with a jet plane.

The third object also began traveling in a northwesterly direction after the two lights. It appeared to be traveling at a great speed, but did not overtake the two objects before they disappeared in the distance over Lake Michigan.

A few seconds after the lights reversed direction, I ran in the house for my camera. Regretfully only two frames were left on the film, numbers 11 and 12. When the photo's were snapped, the two objects were to the upper right of the moon. Perhaps the photo's would not show an object so far away; however, if you feel this film could be of interest, it will be available to you undeveloped.
