





SIGITING DESCRIPTION OF UFO

Milkman be heard a loud sonic boom and looked up to see not an aircraft but a parachute-shaped object moving slowly across the sky from west to east. He attracted the attention of Officer Carapezza who was seated in a cruiser. Carapezza stated that the boom shook the car. Officer Carapezza sighted the object easily. Both agreed that its apparent size was as great as or greater than the full moon; that it was white; that it looked like a parachute canopy without shroud lines rather than a balloon and that it was moving easterly. No Jet Aircraft was seen or heard in the vicinity. Others reported to WEEI that a flash of fire was seen to emanate from the object.

TO ME Hanscom AFB UFO section repeated/what they had heard on WEEI but denied any further knowledge on the subject. The Coast Guard informed WEEI that a weather balloon was responsible and that Hanscom AFB launched it. I phoned Hanscom AFB weather and was told they had not launched a weather balloon. I phoned Air Force Cambridge Research Labs, Hanscom AFB and was told that they had launched a small weather balloon at 7:57 AM.

U.S. Weather, Logan Airport, Boston informed me that the wind was NW at 15-25 mph. The balloon would have been drifting south-easterly agreeing approximately with the witnesses' observations. The sky was crystal clear - no cloud cover.

WALUTED: The balloon was a Radio-Sonde type about 17' in diameter. It carried a package about 10" square suspended by a single cord. It is parachuted by a 2' parachute at balloon burst. The balloon must have been very low to have appeared so large as I was informed that at 3 minutes after launch such a balloon could not be seen with the unaided

eye. An object with the apparent size of 1/4" at an altitude of 10,000 feet would have to be about 80 feet in diameter. A 17 foot balloon would have to be very low in order to appear to be 1/4" in diameter. At this altitude, the instrument package would be clearly seen. The object did not appear to look round like a balloon to the witnesses but rather like a parachute canopy viewed slightly sideways to indicate that it was not a full sphere. Patrolman Carapezza felt certain that it was not a balloon.

Still felt it could have been a parachute because when he first saw it, its diameter was small, but it suddenly became larger as if it were a parachute unfolding.

The USAF took 5 minutes of prime news time on WNAC TV, Boston 6:30 PM to demonstrate a weather balloon launch from Hanscom AFB. I was very surprised that they had bothered to take the time and effort to do this. They have never done this before in this area to the best of my knowledge.

Later on that evening, three groups of teenagers at various points around South Hadley, Massachusetts sighted a UFO described as looking like "a sting ray, but without the long tail. There was one huge light, similar to a spotlight in front with a large grouping of constant red and green lights beneath". It was flying very slowly and at a low altitude. Sighting time was between 10:00 and 11:00 PM.

CONCLUSION: - "PROBABLE WEATHER BALLOON"

Since there was a weather balloon launch 8 minutes prior to the UFO sighting and since the wind was blowing in a direction so as to carry the balloon in the approximate direction that the UFO was headed, I have no choice, without further information but to classify this object as a weather balloom.

Interesting sidelights to this conclusion are the facts that the boom seemed to be connected with the object; the need for the balloon to have been extremely low in order to have such a large apparent size (yet no instrument package was seen); the non-spherical shape and the alleged UFO sighting at S. Hadley in the evening. The fact the Hanscom AFB went out of their way to prove it was a balloon is interesting. The fact that the sonic boom was exceptionally loud but no aircraft was seen or heard is puzzling. (I rarely hear a sonic boom at my office within the Sylvania complex at Waltham but I heard this one clearly!)

It is unfortunate that more data on the description of the object's size and manuevers are not available. Both witnesses described a straight non-descending flight path.


Gentlemen:

Enclosed is a duplicate of a photograph I took about a year ago: I do not recall the exact date. It was taken with my Konica Auto S2 at an exposure time of ten seconds and an aperture of f/1.8 on Anscochrome 100 Daylight Film at about nine o'clock at night. The camera was on a tripod on the lower slopes of Camelback Mountain facing southwest toward Phoenix, which is the mass of lights near the bottom of the picture.

When the slide is projected on a forty-by-fifty-inch screen, there is visible in the upper center of the picture a red light surrounded by several apparently separate white ones, the whole assembly emitting a sort of blue glow. Though there are some scratches on the film, this is not one of them, and it was a cloudy night, so no stars are visible. I do not believe the object (assuming it is one) can be an airplane, because in a tensecond exposure a plane would have left a streak. In short, I don't know what it was. However, I do believe it is a genuine

photographic image on the film.

(I did not see the object in the sky at the time, perhaps because I was concentrating on the city lights, and I knew nothing of it until the film was processed) I took a few other photographs that night, but this is the only one that came out clearly and the only one at this angle of view (I was trying a series a series of different exposure times for experimental purposes: this is why I know the exact exposure data: it is recorded in my notes). I had pretty well forgotten the whole thing until I recently read Frank Edwards' book. Flying Saucers—Serious Business. Then I had duplicates made and sent one to your organization, one to the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena, one to the Aerial Phenomena Research Organization, and on to Mr. Edwards. The original remains in my possession. I would appreciate any comment or explanation you may have on this photo.

- 1. PURPOSE: This report serves to answer Work Order Number 67-64 in which it was requested by Major Quintanilla that an analysis be made to determine the identity of an unidentified object in a color slide submitted by Mr.
- 2. ANALYSIS: In scanning the photography it was noted that while the lights of the city indicated a triple exposure (due to camera movement or vibration) the subject point of interest produced a single image and therefore could not be a realistic photographic recording of an actual object. The rationale for this conclusion is that (a) if it (the object) were stationary or hovering, it would also register as a triple exposure and (b) if it were moving, the image would result in a blur or streak across the sky during the 10 (ten) second exposure time quoted by the observer.
- 3. Although the determination of the exact cause of the image was hampered by our not being able to examine the original film, it is the opinion of this office that the image was caused by a defect in the film or was inadvertently produced during the processing phase of development.






