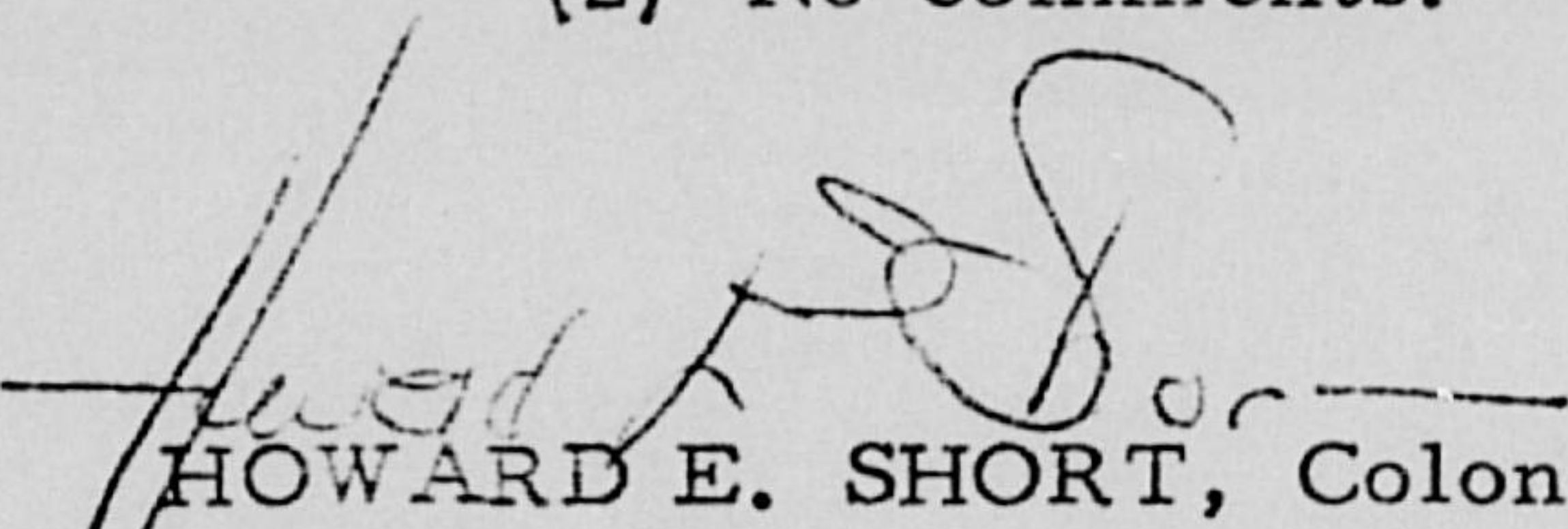

2. The following incident was reported to the Space Systems Division Command Post, 14 March 1966.
 - a. Mr. [REDACTED] age 41, President of the Copper Brite Corp. [REDACTED] Westchester, California, reported he has still photographs with an unidentified object in evidence.
