





Within minutes, the same electrical cut-out occurred again. This time, as he was tinkering under the hood, he noticed lights along the ocean beach and figured a beach buggy was going along eastward, more or less parallel with him.

But the light veered offshore and then returned. As it moved slowly over his head to the radio towers, it shone — the most brilliant white light Mr. Field says he has ever seen — and its shape was that of a torpedo. He judged it to be between 50 and 75 feet long, and about 700 feet overhead.

At the towers, the object suddenly took off "faster than a jet," it seemed, towards Gardiner's Island and beyond, to Fisher's Island. It went out of sight in a moment, he said. There was not a sound, nor did he see a car, until he passed the Devon turn at Amagansett as he rushed to Town Police head-quarters to tell his story.

Three Mile Harbor

Five minutes before Mr. Field entered the station at 10:15 p.m. Dallas Spicer of Abraham's Path near Three Mile Harbor Road had finally called the police about having seen, together with his wife, "a very funny light just over the telephone pole" at the road near their house. It was pale blue, and it made the pole cast a shadow, which moved left and right as the light itself moved to and fro.

Mrs. Spicer had phoned the police a moment later to say that the light was "very bright, and it is not a star."

At 10:45, Mrs. Spicer called a second time, to report that the light "got very bright and was leaving the area just over the trees, towards East Hampton." And a few moments later she called to say that "the object" was over the Hampton Cablevision television tower — large and glowing brightly.

After the Spicer's first call, Sergeant Russell Sanders went to the area, but he called in to say that he had not seen "the same."

He headed homewards, seemingly followed by the object, so he drove on to the Town dock on Three Mile Harbor Road. The shape circled over the water and headed towards East Hampton. It seemed oval and had a yellowish, reddish tinge by that time, he told Mrs. Lester.



as the unidentified flying object capital of the Northeast, or perhaps of Suffolk County, continues untarnished. Last Thursday evening. County Department of Health and just eight days after the initial sightings here, residents of the Abraham's Path area again observed Phenomena, visited the scene. strange lights in the sky.

This time, they were joined in their observations by a veteran and unexcitable member of the Town Police Force. The Abraham's Path lights, in their second sighting, did not this time coincide with a view of a torpedo-shaped object of the sort seen at Napeague Beach March 30.

The latest episode began at 8:04 p.m. April 7, when Mrs. Dallas Spicer of 37A Abraham's Path, near Three Mile Harbor, reported seeing an unidentified flying object. Mr. and Mrs. Spicer had reported overhead lights near the telephone poles there March 30.

Rising In West

Patrolman Paul Greenwood and Sergeant Russell Sanders were dispatched to the scene, and were told by the Spicers that they had observed a light rising in the west, fairly rapidly, and that it had halted high in the sky to the northeast.

Patrolman Greenwood said later that he then observed it himself, "like the brightest planet." Sergeant Sanders was noncommital.

The Patrolman braced himself against the patrol car, observing the object glowing high in the sky. After a while, he said, it appeared to move in a figure-eight pattern, its motion apparent against nearby fixed stars.

Mr. and Mrs. David Webb of East Hampton Knolls, Patrolman Greenwood reported, arrived with a pair of binoculars. He said they stated that they had seen the object from their home earlier.
