Size of softball when first observed, increasing to size of beachball as range to object decreased. Orange-reddish changing to blue-white, fluorescent type color. Pulsating sound increasing in frequency and volume as range to object decreased. Sound was picked-up and transmitted through car radio and speaker system. Object was approx. 45° elevation. Observers attention was attracted to the object by its color and movement across the path of the auto. Object continued towards the observers car but for only a very few seconds. As the object approached, the pulsating sound was heard with increasing frequency and volume, coming from the car radio. Object increased its altitude, (cont'd on back)

PATH OF THE AUTO. APPROXIMATELY 45 DEGREE ELEVATION.
NO ESTIMATE OF ALTITUDE. (2) NINE MILES NORTH OF
LEWISBURG, INDIANA. (3) ONE MILE NORTH OF LEWISBURG,
INDIANA. (4) MRS. [REDACTED] WITH HER CHILDREN, WAS NINE
MILES NORTH OF LEWISBURG, DRIVING SOUTH ON A COUNTRY
ROAD. THEIR ATTENTION WAS ATTRACTED TO THE OBJECT BY ITS
COLOW AND MOVEMENT ACROSS THE PATH OF THE AUTO. THE
OBJECT WAS VIEWED ONLY A VERY SHORT TIME WHEN IT
MANUEVERED REPIDLY AND SMOOTHLY, DESCENDING TOWARDS THE
WINDSHIELD OF THE CAR. FEAR OF FALLING DEBRIS FROM
AIRCRAFT AND APPARENT COLLISION COURSE WITH THE AUTO
MRS. [REDACTED] STOPPED THE CAR. THE OBJECT CONTINUED
TOWARDS THE GILLEM AUTO BUT FOR ONLY A VERY FEW
SECONDS. AS THE OBJECT APPROACHED THE PULSATING SOUND

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WAS HEARD WITH INCREASING FREQUENCY AND VOLUME, COMING
FROM THE CAR RADIO. THE RADUO WAS TURNED OFF THE
SOUND DECREASED IN VOLUME BUT REMAINED AUDIBLE WITH THE
CAR WINDOWS UP AND CAR DOORS CLOSED. MRS. [REDACTED]
STATED SHE WAS AFRAID FOR THEIR SAFETY. SHE STARTED
DRIVING, CONTINUING SOUTH TOWARDS U.S. HIGHWAY 24, AT
A CONSIDERABWY HIGHER RATE OF SPEED THAN SHE NORMALLY
DRIVES AT NIGHT. THE OBJECT REMAINED POSITIONED ABOVE
THE AUTO. UPON ARRIVING AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE

COUNTRY ROAD AND U.S. 24, MRS. GILLEN TURNED LEFT 90 DEGREES, HEADING EAST TOWARDS PERU INDIANA. AS THE AUTO ENTERED ONTO U.S. 24, THE OBJECT INCREASED ITS ALTITUDE, INSTANTANEOUSLY CHANGED COLOR TO THE BLUE/WHITE, FLUORESCENT TYPE COLOR, AND REMAINING AT ALTITUDE AND MAINTAINING THE BLUE/WHITE COLOR CONTINUED ITS POSITION ABOVE AND SLIGHTLY IN FRONT OF THE AUTO. ONE MILE NORTH OF LEWISBURG INDIANA, MRS. G. TURNED 90 DEGREES RIGHT OFF U.S. 24 ONTO THE ROAD LEADING INTO LEWISBURG. (5) AT THE TIME MRS. G. STARTED THE TURN OFF US 24 TOWARDS LEWISBURG, THE OBJECT INCREASED

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ITS SPEED VERY RAPIDLY AND DISAPPEARED IN A CLIMBING COURSE, CONTINUING EAST TOWARDS PERU INDIANA. (6) ABOUT 15 MINUTES.

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K. STAFF INTELLIGENCE OFFICER CHIEF COMBAT INTELLIGENCE. ALTHOUGHT SHE WAS AFRAID, SHE SAID SHESDID NOT PANIC BUT ACTED WITH REASONABLE AND NORMAL RESPONSE. SINCE MRS G [REDACTED] WORKS IN AN ENVIRONMENT REQUIRING STABILITY DURING EMERGENCIES, SHE PROBABLY REACTED IN A SIMILAR MANNER ON THIS OCCASION. DURING THE INVESTIGATION SHE REMAINED CALM AND COOPERATIVE. THE INVESTIGATION OFFICER IS UNABLE TO PROVIDE A POSSIBLE CAUSE OF THE SIGHTING.
