

It seemed to take on a dancing as a flaming or fire flickers. No stars in the sky. It disappeared in 10 Minutes.  Very possibly the star Sirius seen through a break in the clouds Disappearance would be accounted for because of the clouds.

Unidentified Flying Object Sighting by Some Highland Heights, Kentucky, on 31 March 1966

TO: FTD (TDE)

- Highland Heights, Kentucky (Occupation: Student at Villa Madonna, Covington, Kentucky), telephoned the OSI Detachment 501 office, Cincinnati, Ohio, to report sighting UFO at approximately 2256 hours, 31 March 1966. Stated that he observed the object for approximately ten minutes; that it appeared to be a white light with a red light either flashing or revolving around the white light. He stated that it remained in one position on the South Southwestern Kentucky sky and upon looking at it with binoculars it seemed to take on a "dancing" as a flame or fire flickers. The stated he first noticed this when he noticed there were no stars in the sky. He further added that he did not look at it for about ½ minute and when he looked back, it was gone.
