
I am eighteen years old; can avid reader of UFO reports. I was sure it was a one in a million chance that I would ever see one. I did better than that.

I was in my back yard Tuesday, the twenty-six, about 7:50 P.M. I had my binoculars and telescope. I didn't have anything to do so I went out to look at the stars, moon, etc. The sky was absolutely clear. I glanced to my left. I couldn't believe what I saw. I hurried and put the binoculars to my eyes. There was about twelve small bright dots. They were just as bright as stars. They flew in a V-shape as birds do, but weren't in a definite pattern. They were flying close together. Soon as I looked through the binoculars, I noticed one was lagging behind a slight bit; it rapidly caught up to the rest. They were traveling in a easterly direction.
