 (telephone: 26 at 1255 hrs 30 July 1966. He stated that he had received a call on the evening of 29 July 1966 from (telephone to concerning a UFO she had sighted in the Coldwater area. It was an "orangish" object, and she reported seeing it several times.
- 2. Mr. was interested in whether or not we had any further information on it or any other reports of UFO sightings in the area. He asked that a Project BLUE BOOK representative call him on Tuesday, 2 August.
- 3. No mention was made of the UFO reported on 29 July 1966 to the Duty Officer by Months of Cincinnati. An FTD Form 164 was not completed on the Coldwater report as there was no specific information.
