Dear Sirs:

I feel obligated to report an observation I made about 7:10 A.M., Oct. 14. I was on my way to the bus stop when I noticed two reddish-orange lights in the sky. Not being a good judge of distance I cannot estimate their positions except to say they were towards the north, possibly over Eastlake. As I watched they kept blinking on and off and then began to move. The one on the right would blink off and move very quickly and then blink on again at its new position. It continued this movement towards the west while the other, also blinking moved at a slower + more steady pace directly away from me. Being unable to watch both I kept watching the slower

one until it disappeared from my
view behind some trees. At the
time could I make out any form
to these objects, only the blinking light.
I find no explanation for them!

The movement was far too fast &
particularly the jerking movement of
the faster one for them to have been
airplanes. Unfortunately, no one was
with me to verify this & no one
else seems to have seen them. I
swear that this is true, though. I
