

30 Seconds	Observer noted marked round object travel overhead and disappeared from view after about thirth seconds. There was also a humming sound heard. The object was dark and had three white lights in front.  Investigation revealed that a C-124 aircraft landed at McClellan AFB at the time of the signting. From the available data it appears that the observer saw this aircraft on its final approach.

## TO: AFSC (FTD)

- 1. The following observation was reported to Dispatcher Fred McClure, Operations Branch (BBP) on 8 Nov 1966.
  - a. Description of the object observed:
    - (1) Shape round
    - (2) Size approximately 50 feet wide at largest point
    - (3) Color dark and had three white lights in front
    - (4) Number one
    - (5) Formation not applicable
    - (6) Discernible features none
    - (7) Tail, trail, or exhaust none
    - (8) Sound loud clear humming sound
    - (9) Unusual features clear humming sound, not like a jet aircraft
  - b. Description of course of object:
    - (1) Heard the sound
  - (2) Angle of elevation and azimuth 45 degrees from the ground 100 feet in height
    - (3) Description of flight path- passed over her head
  - (4) How object disappeared object disappeared suddenly from sight; and the sound also
    - (5) Length of time in view thirty seconds
    - c. Manner of observation:
      - (1) Ground-visual
      - (2) No optical aids used

- d. Time and date of sighting:
  - (1) 0510Z, 2 Nov 1966
  - (2) Night
- e. Location of observer: Standing on her front porch, looking north,
  North Sacramento, California.
- f. Observer Mrs. North Sacramento, California. Twenty-five years of age and a divorced housewife.
  - g. Weather and wind conditions at the time of sighting:
    - (1) Observer's account black night, no stars and no wind
- (2) A check with McClellan AFB weather station reveals the night was clear, visibility 5 miles, haze and smoke with wind from the east at 4 knots.
  - (3) Ceiling unlimited
  - (4) Visibility 5 miles
  - (5) Cloud cover none
  - h. McClellan AFB weather station reported that there was smoke and haze.
  - i. Interception none
- j. A check with McClellan AFB Base Operations revealed that a C-124 landed at McClellan AFB at the time of this sighting.
- k. Preparing officer feels that complainant is a highly excitable person, a divorcee who imagined she heard shuffling noise outside the house at night and has seen footprints on the fence as though someone had been walking there. Preparing officer also feels that complainant sighted the C-124 in its traffic pattern as it landed at McClellan AFB at the time of this sighting.
- 1. A check with local law enforcement agencies revealed no other reports of this nature had been received.
