

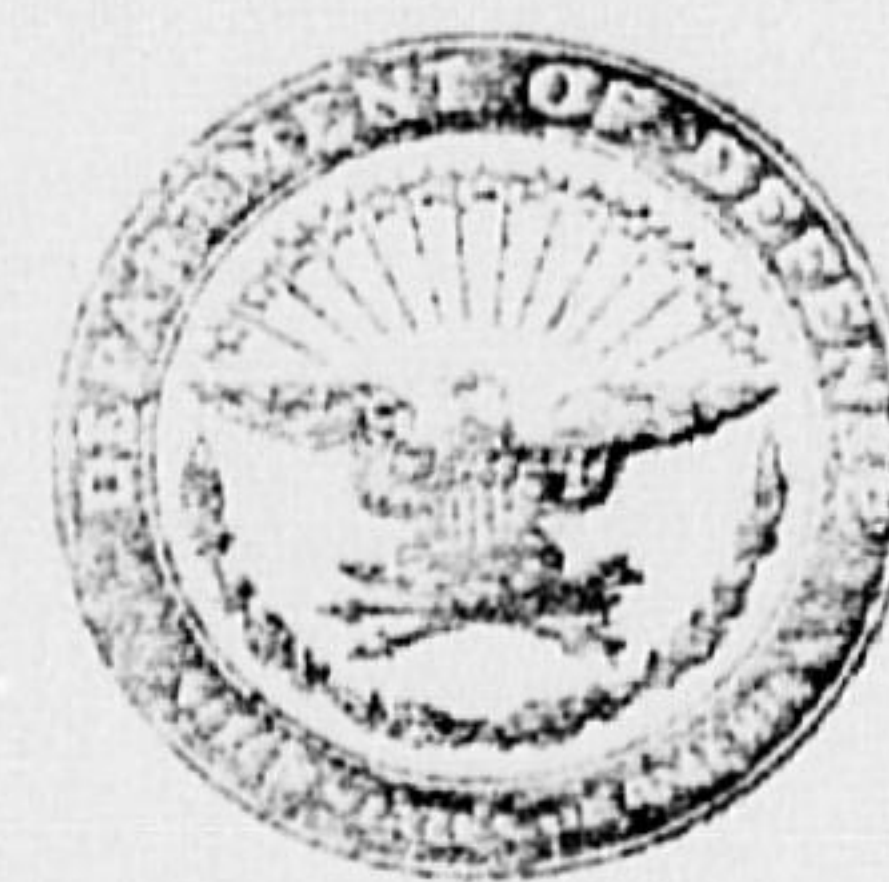

As far as I know, any plane used by civilians could not have maintained altitude at the slow speed it was moving.

I have tried many angles, Police Dept. Lockheed, test pilot at Lockheed, civilians by the dozens. No one saw it other than we three.

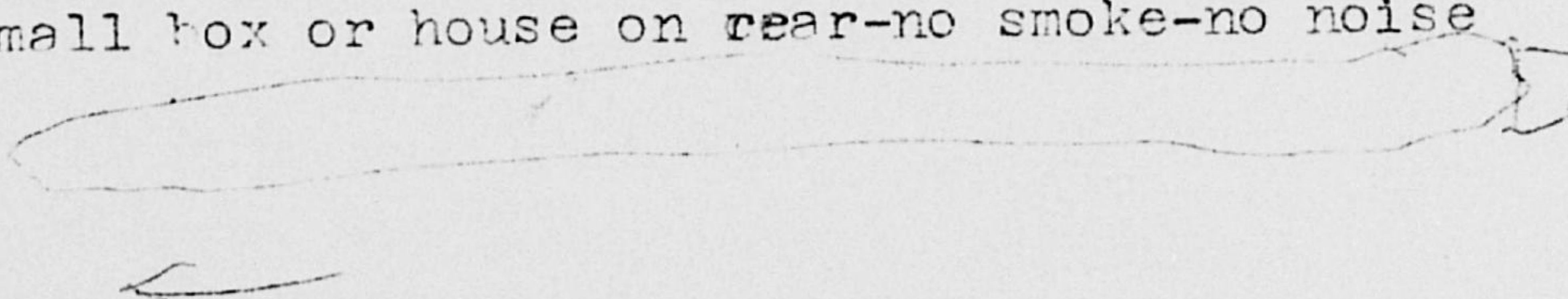

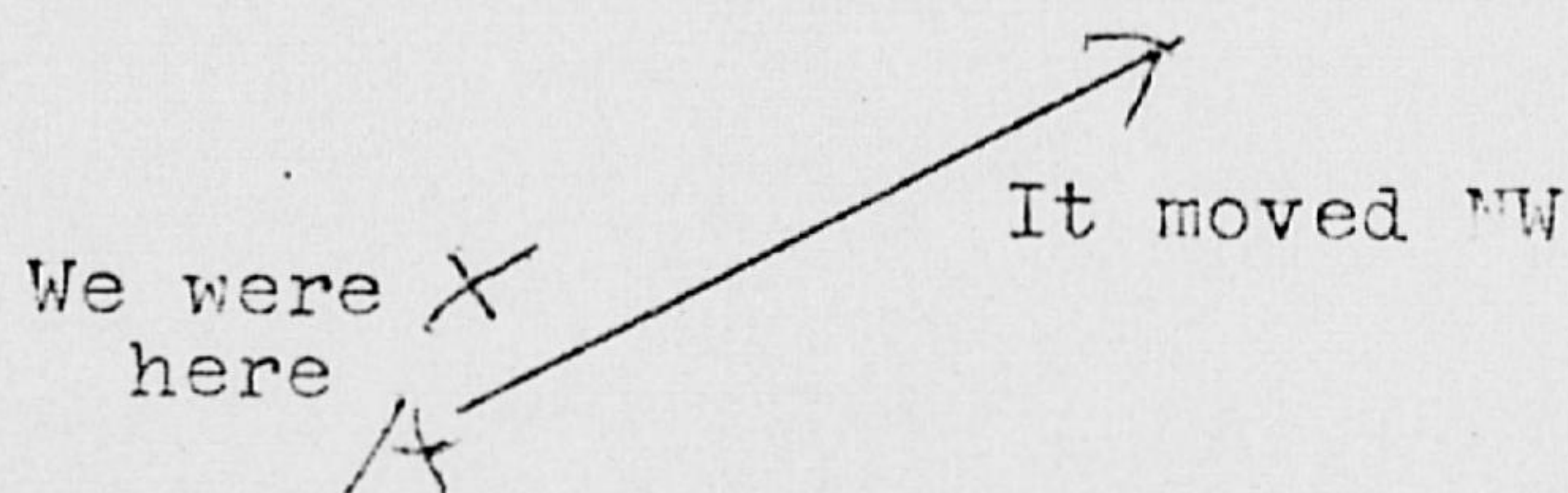
