

Looked like a wingless plane; could have been as long as the 707, maybe longer,


Had no wings; box like house on the back.

It moves slowly Morth West; our home is in the Verdugo Hills, on the extreme South tip of the hills. 1720 Hillcrest.


As far as I know, any plane used by civilians could not have maintained altitude at the slow speed it was moving.






