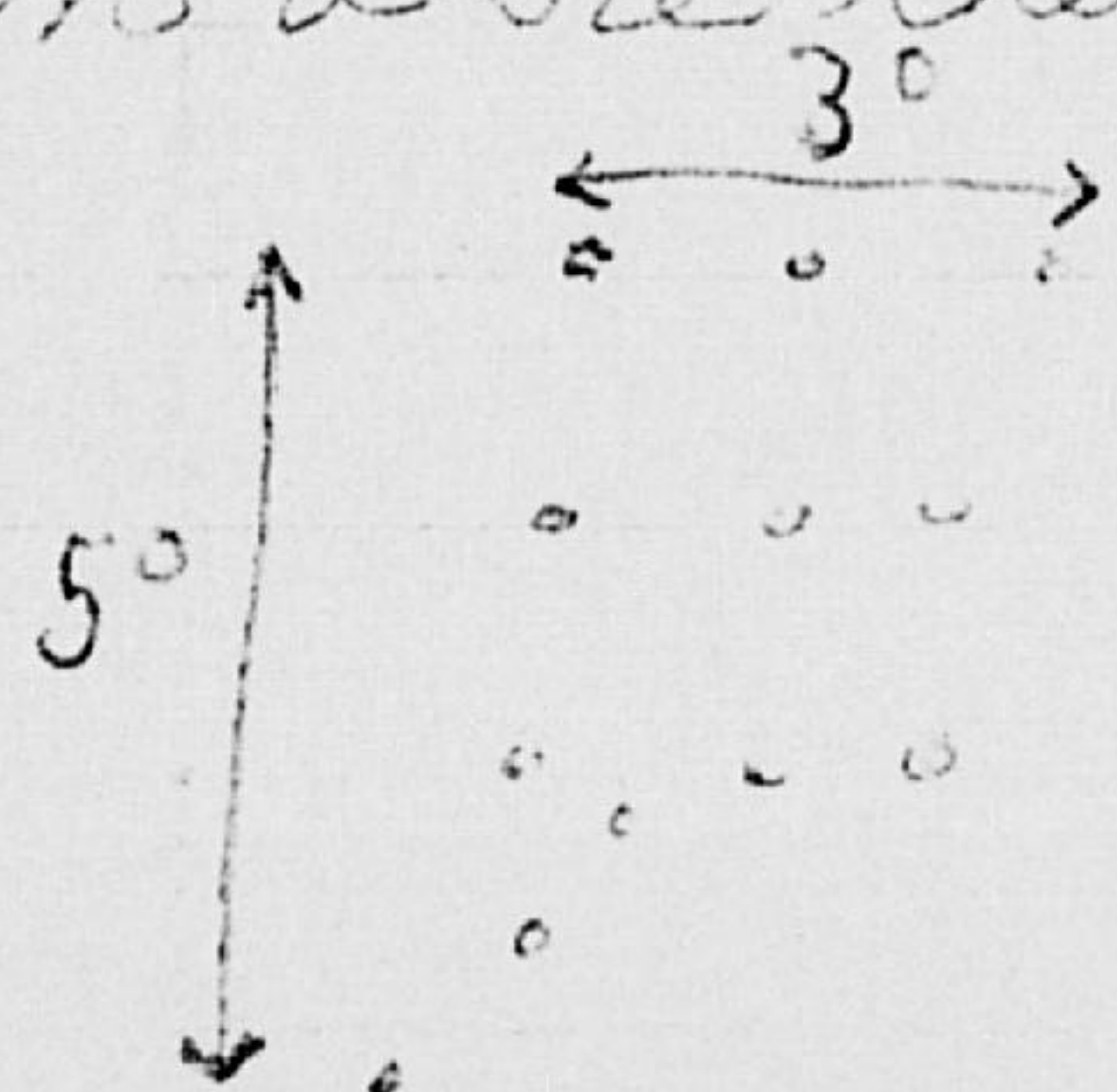

#1 One of my sightings was February 10th. I saw it around 7:00 PM. The UFO was sphere shaped. It was a red luminous body. I first saw it in the south east. It was approx 5° above the horizon. It was as bright as Sirius and 3 times as large as Venus. I barely made out a faint white light in the rear of the ~~was~~ UFO. I only saw the white light in the rear for the first few minutes. About the time it got in the east it started pulsating. When it started pulsating it was about 8° above the horizon. It kept on going toward the north. When it was in the north it was a little lower than at first about 1° lower. All the time I saw it it got dimmer little by little. What called my attention to it was its size, bright red color, and brightness. There was no sound. I saw it for about 15 minutes. There was no vapor trail, tail, or exhaust. It pulsed about once a second.

There was approx. 12. They were first

sighted in the south-west. They were black and ^{twice} as large as Sirius. They were flying in a formation like this  They weren't flying very fast. They made no noise. They kept the same formation all the time I watched. It I saw them for about 30 seconds. When they got in the west I went to get my camera. When I got back it was gone. They weren't more than 100 yards away. They were about 5° above the horizon. They were perfect spheres. What caught my attention to them were their area.



There was no sound, vapor trails, tails, or exhaust.

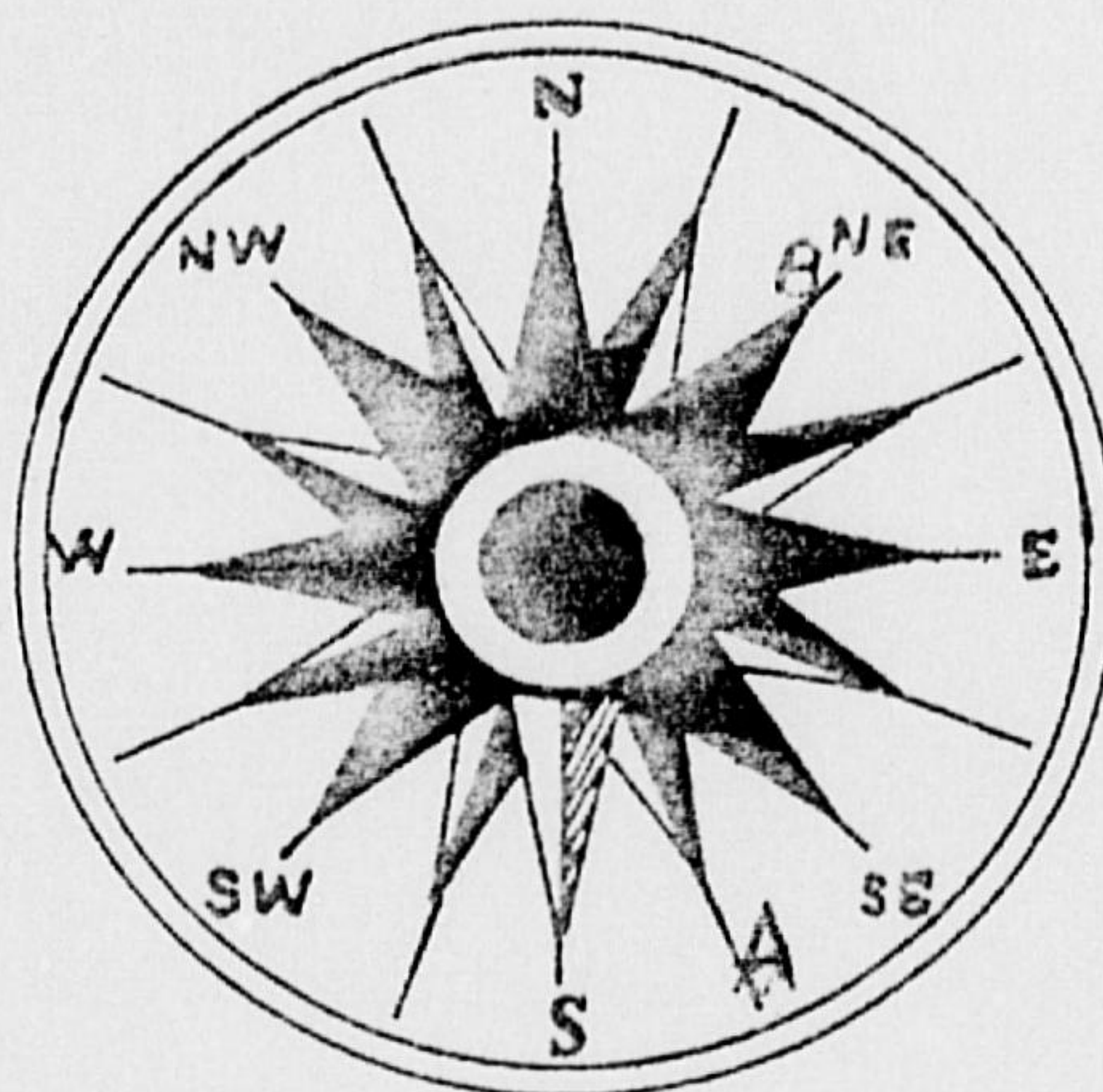
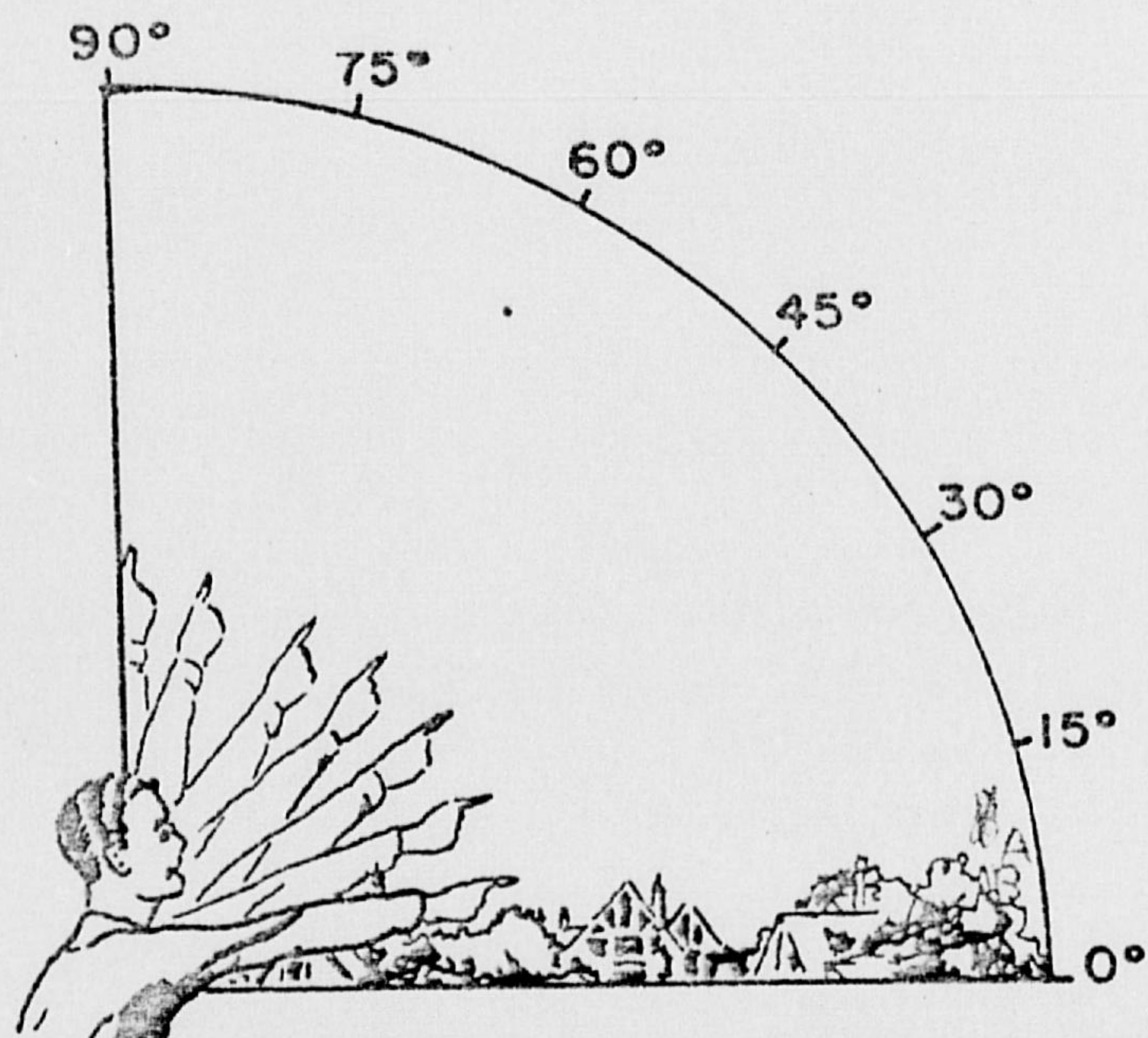

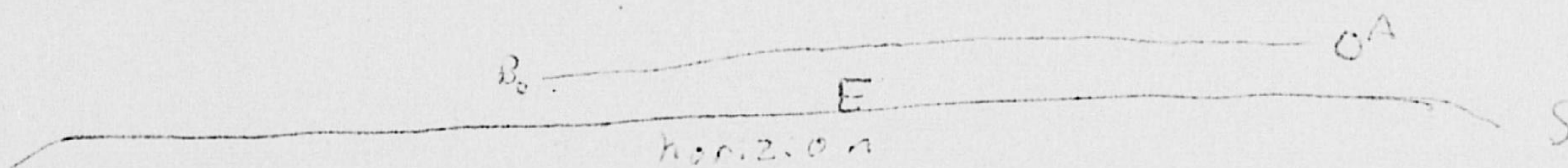
