

Received a call from Major Nyls, Selfridge AFB, Michigan concerning a UFO sighted by various people in Benton Harbor, Michigan on 6 March 67 @ 0040EST. One observer Mr reported the observation to Major Nyls. Mr s phone number is 983-3992 area code 616. He works at Station WSJM St. Josephs, Michigan.

Contact with Mr. revealed that his wife had heard a funny sound in the driveway which had waken her up. The sound was like snowtires crunching on snow. She got up and looked out the window and saw a saucer traveling toward Lake Michigan. She watched this saucer for about 20 minutes then awoke her husband at 0100EST. The saucer was as big as a Greyhound bus. It was as big as a tangerine held at arms length. Its shape was oval and Mr. could invision a saucer shape. Mr. Sonly saw the object over the lake. At 0142EST another saucer met the first and they hovered for several minutes before disappearing. Various colors were notedred, yellow, green, and white. 




