- ① called by brother at 2100 hrs, 29 Mar 67, to observe object which he said stopped, moved, dimmed and brightened.
- ② Ma [REDACTED] said she and friend observed and the object standing still to the right of W410 tower. The object moved slowly to the right, away from the tower. The tower is located west of the observer.
- ③ The object initially was 5 times as bright as a bright star and then dimmed. The object size appeared to be slightly smaller than the radio tower s/c warning lights.
- ④ The object was observed to dim as an aircraft passed to the left of it. It appeared to have a bright center with a glow surrounding it, "like a dirty headlight".
- ⑤ The moon was not observed. It was a clear night. Object out of sight at 2140 hrs.
