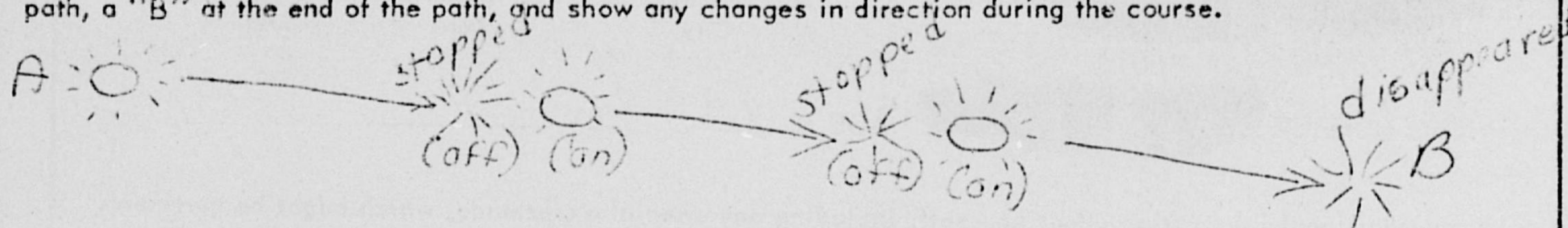

Dear Sirs:

At approximately 9:45 this evening, my younger sister and I observed a U.F.O. in the sky while stargazing. I am 15 years old and my sister is 11. For the past 4 months or so, I have been a serious student of the U.F.O. mystery but beleive me, I never thought I'd see one myself. Let me describe to you what I saw and perhaps you may be able to find an explâination for it.

My sister, an unbeleiver in U.F.O.'s, sighted the object first and attracted my attention to it. My first impression was that it was some sort of a pllane or satellite, but after watching its strange behavior I realized that it was something out of the ordinary. It was a fairly bright, consistant white light, with occasional flashings of red. It first appeared directly overhead, moved across the sky a distance, blinked off, blinked on, and continued to do this until it was rather low in the north-east sky. It then completely vanished, just like a light being turned off. That was the last we saw of it. And another strange thing, as I have read in many U.F.O. reports, a low-flying jet came into the sky about 10 minutes later and went off in the same direction from which the U.F.O. disappeared. Please beleive me, I have never seen anything like this before. I would be happy to fill out one of your U.F.O. Sighting forms, in hopes that you may be able to explain what I saw.
