Dear Sir :

On December 19th, 1967 I was driving from Cloudcroft, New Mexico on route 82 toward Artesia, N.M.

At a point about 10 miles west of the location where Hiway # 13 takes one North to Roswell, N.M. I saw a large amber light to the right side of the Hiway at an angle of about 15 o. It seemed to be moving a little South of Due East.

The Moon was bright, near a full moon, and was to my left at an angle of about 20 o. The time was about 7:30 P.M.

At first I took it to be a Warning light on a snow plow; However it did not go around and flash; also it stayed on a straight course and did not disappear as it would have since this area is hilly with many turns in the roadway.

I stopped several times and glassed the object with my 7 X 50 binoculars. Judging the distance at 5 miles and the normal increase of vision with the glasses it appeared to be from 150 to 200 ftwide. It was true amber color and seemed to get only slightely brighter then darker to the same degree. There was no unusual sounds, which I could hear. If there was any wimd it was very light and certainly not enough to carry a balton more then 40 miles.

When the lights of Artesia came into view it lifted And Passed just South of the city, gaining altitude so that it passed near the top of a radio tower which had a red light on top of it. The time was near 8:30 P.M.

I made some pictures with a good Bell & Howell 8 mm movie camera. If it shows up when film is developed I will send you part of it.

K have traveled West Texas and New Mexico for the past 10 years Have seen some strange things along the White Sands proving grounds; this was the most baffling; and would be interested in knowing if anyone else saw this object.
