



DESCRIPTION: At first one light, later one white light and a flashing

red and green light.

HEIGHT: Felt that it was low. It seemed to be circling the Golf

course. Thinks that the guards at Monsanto would have had to have seen the object since it was right over them.

Lt Marano called Base FAA 19 Mar: Was informed that it could have been one of our base helicopters on VFR but there is no way for the tower to really say. Unless it acted really strangely the controller would assume it to be a small plane on VFR. Suggested I contact the helicopter service at Vandalia.

Called Skyway Inc, 898-4615 and Dayton Helicopter Service 224-1451. Neither had helicotpers out at 4 am. Also called Souther Ohio Aviation Co 866-2427. They stated that there could have been a light plane out of the field but they wouldn't have record of it.

Called the Monsant Plant at Miamisburg 866-7444. None of the guards reported seeing anything unusual for the 1200 to 8 am shift.
