



UFOs Seen Northeast Of Capital

Bismarck Three control tower personnel, an airplane pilot from the Capital City and others were mystified Tuesday night sighting unidentified flying stantia objects northeast of Bismarck.

Jack Wilhelm of the Bismarck Airport control tower said he and two other personnel, Jack Reeves and John Fishcer, sighted two round, white-colored objects about the size of a large star about 5:40 p.m.

They tipped off Robert Watts of Capital Aviation, who was flying a student in the vicinity of the airport, and they too witnessed the UFOs, de- nist for scribing them in terms identical to the control tower reports.

Wilhelm and Watts said an Air force radar system based at Great Falls, Mont., picked up "foreign objects" at the time, positioning the is UFO,s about 85 miles northeast of Bismarck.

There were indications that the Air Force was being called in to further investigate the sightings.

Wihelm said his tower received "a rash of calls" last week Tuesday from citizens who reported somewhat similar objects at about the same time of night in the same approximate location. He said those reports claimed sound emanated from the objects-"sound something like they never heard before".

No sounds were heard Tuesday night.

Wilhelm said the changes in speed and direction of move-One ment discounted the likeli-(139) hood of the UFOs being stars.

He noted the objects were foreign to the airport control tower as well as to the Great Falls radar system, since they were not listed on flight plans.

Watts discounted the possibility of the objects being airplanes or normal oribiting objects. He said they traveled considerably faster than aircraft, and, because of the speed and direction changes, could not be normal, unmanned satelites.

The two objects then hovered close together for a few seconds and "after that they just diappeared," said Wolhelm. He said that in a "split second" they disappeared in an northeasterly direction.

Before the two objects joined, one was positioned about 45 degrees above the horizon, while the other was 30 degrees above the horizon. The lower object moved up to join the higher, said Wilhelm.

Watts gave a similar discription of the objects, except he noted he did not witness the two objects disappearing.
