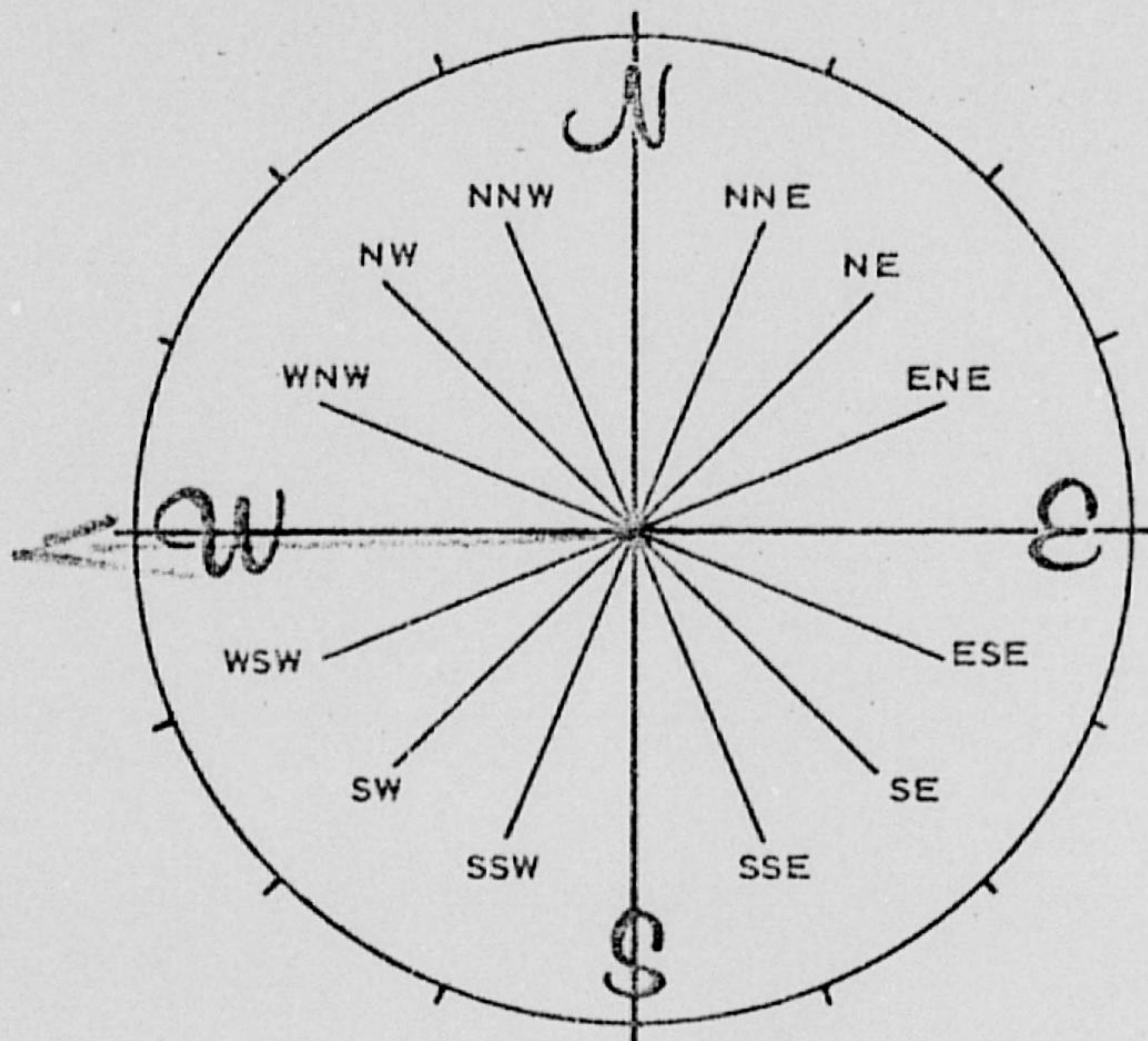

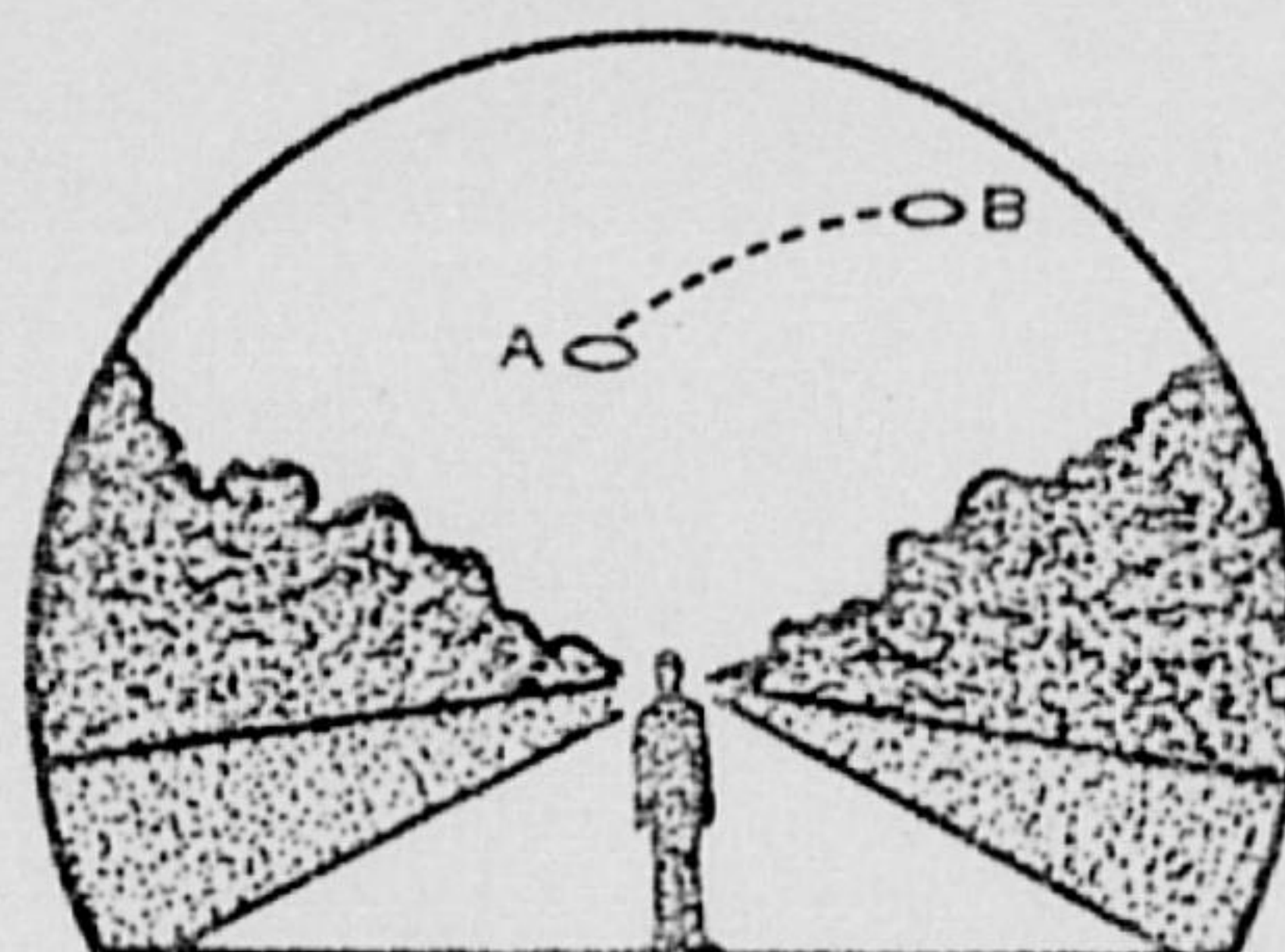
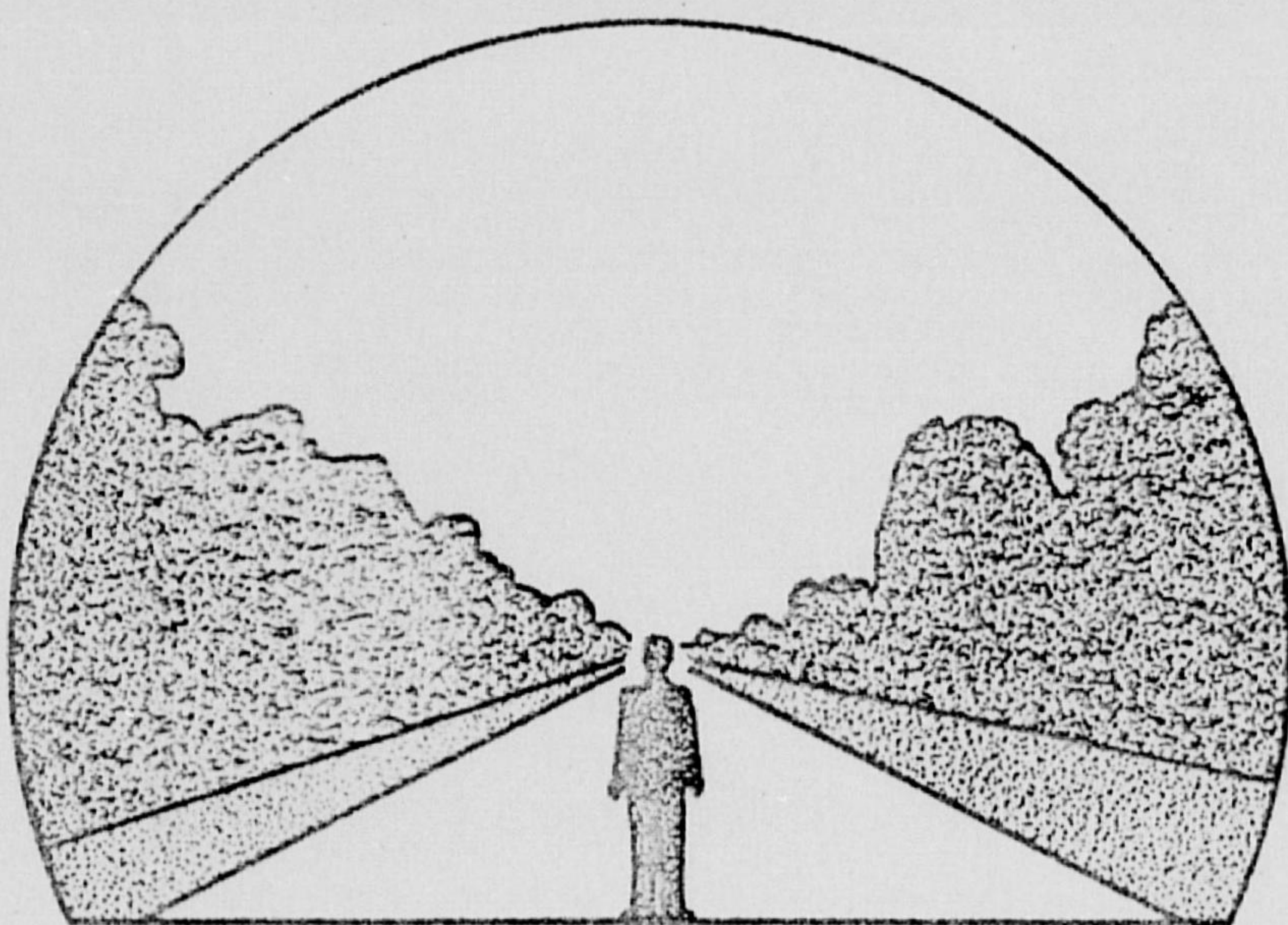

Dear Sirs:

This is to inform you of the U.S.A.F. that on the night of February 10, 1969, from 7:45 until 7:52 I witnessed the flight of a UFO. I am not a crackpot, nor am I seeking publicity. I am merely informing you for what good it may do. I'll admit, I am interested in UFO's and have a few books concerning them, but I also have books that have the Air Force view. I have read the various ways you think we may be fooled by conventional objects & natural phenomena, but I assure you there was nothing conventional or natural about this.

I first noticed the "thing" outside my window, off above a field. It hovered a while, glowing brightly with a bright yellow light. It moved to my left very slowly, still glimmering. It started to change color. It went from yellow to orange and later to bright red. It picked up speed, still moving left until it was at about the center of my

view. It hovered a few minutes, and then
came back to the right about $\frac{1}{4}$ the way. By now
it was a bright red. It stopped a few seconds,
and seemingly moving away from me, disappeared.
Keep in mind that this early in the evening
there were no stars in the sky, nor was the moon
yet visible. The sun had gone down long ago,
so it could not have been a reflection off
the top of a weather balloon, and it was
too big to have been a kid's hoop, and
it was moving against the wind.
